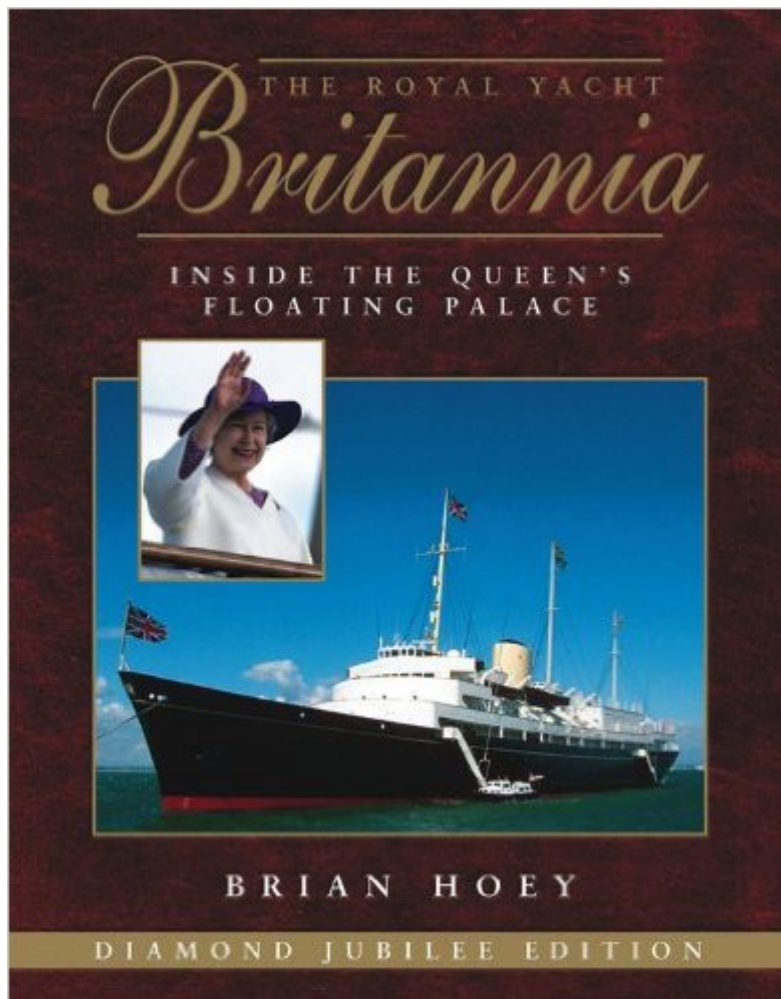

Almost every American President in Queen Elizabeth's long life has been to some degree suborned since she assumed her reign in 1952. The full story of secret wheeling and dealing, since President Eisenhower ought properly to be a matter of not just modern historians; but, utmost national security for any true patriot willing to investigate. A few examples of this will be mentioned here: Queen Elizabeth traveled on board with members of Nikita Khrushchev's inner-circle; after her meeting him at Buckingham Palace.
