

I don't write many reviews on anything, but I felt I needed to for this book. First, let me say, I really enjoyed the first book in this series. It was a departure from the cliché stories that plague many books, and all the main and most the supporting characters were well fleshed out and interesting. The second book I didn't enjoy quite as much because the author made a bold choice with the theme, so I give it a little bit of a pass for creativity. This book is more of a return to form with the first book, which I approve of, but was not well executed. There are a couple major problems with the book. 1. Grammar and spelling mistakes are rampant. Whoever the editor is has done a poor job. There are many full sentences in this book that don't make any sense. This pulls me out of a book when I see blatant mistakes. 2. Continuing the theme of #1, there are whole paragraphs, and even

pages of this book that don't properly set a scene, so getting engrossed in the story is difficult, as you can't visualize what is going on.³ Moving right along from paragraphs and pages, the whole book seems unfocused and with no real plot for a large majority of this book. In the first two books, there was a clear and present antagonistic presence. There seems to be none in this book. I thought the second book was a departure from the first because the author didn't know where to take the story in a realistic way, after the first book became so popular. I have confirmed my suspicions, because the third book simply doesn't have a story. It seems clear to me that the author hasn't laid out a long term plan for the full story arc of Penny, and just seems to be trying to buy time by releasing books to keep his readership (somewhat) engaged in his world.⁴
